



Biodiversity in Development - CEREL Twilight Seminar

New Zealand's natural world is internationally renowned, but it is under significant threat from pests, climate change and the direct impacts of development activities such as farming, urbanisation and resource extraction. Biodiversity decline continues; undue numbers of species of plants, birds and animals are vulnerable or endangered.

The speakers will address the need for strategic change and specific practical action. They will analyze particular innovative tools and approaches, and the special challenge of complex environments such as the coastal marine area.

The Centre for Environmental, Resources and Energy Law (CEREL) Twilight Seminar is co-hosted by the Environmental Research Institute (ERI) and the Environmental

Defence Society (EDS).
