Background: Recent government freshwater reforms aim to improve how freshwater is managed in New Zealand. For example the NPS-FM 2014 requires councils to include mechanisms in regional plans to allow freshwater quality objectives to be met. These may include "edge-of-field" mitigations such as constructed wetlands, and larger multi-landowner mitigations such as Integrated Constructed Wetlands (ICWs). ICWs involve the reanimation (restoration) of wetlands to treat point and diffuse sources of polluted water while delivering on extensive biodiversity, cultural, aesthetic, and recreational values at local and catchment scales. We are lucky to have Dr Rory Harrington (Ireland), founder of the ICW concept, visit New Zealand in mid-February 2016 and present a seminar/workshop on ICWs, and how they might be applied to New Zealand situations.

The presentation will cover 30 years of engagement in land and water management including:

- Towards coherent land, water (and air) management
- Ecological reanimation and restoration
- Integrating social, economic, environmental, and cultural needs
